



e+text+books: do they add up?

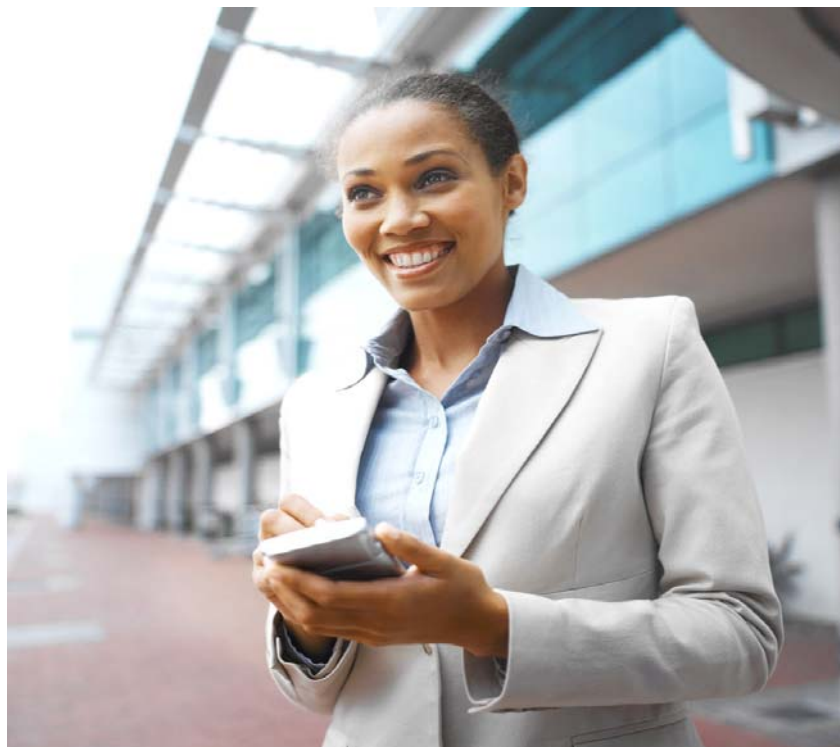

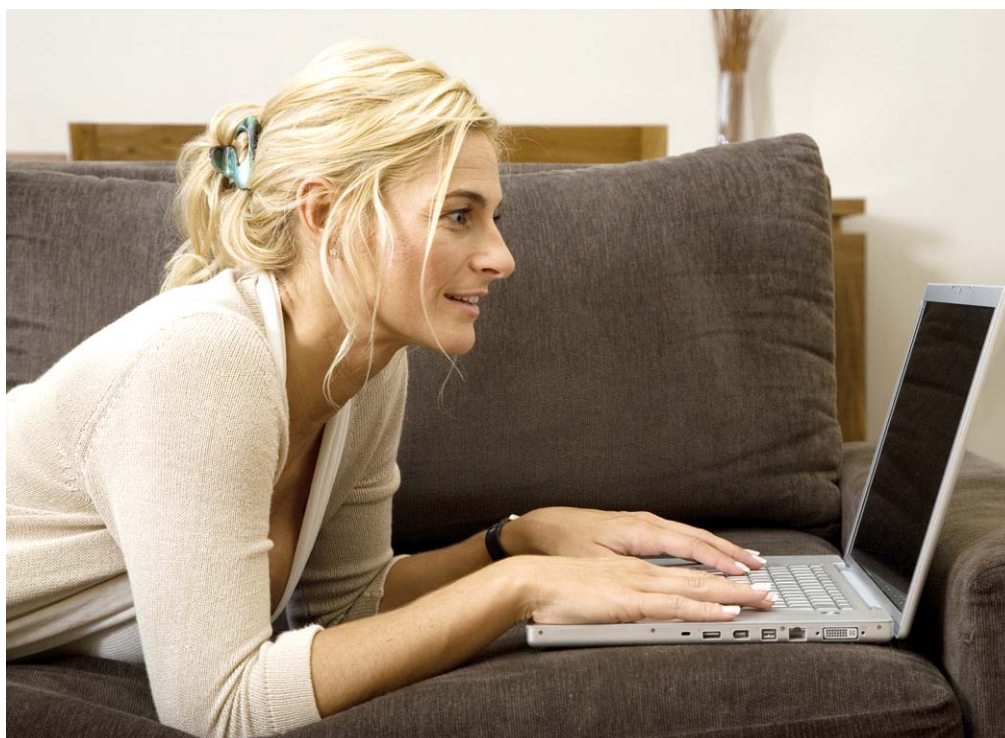
